TRANSFER AGREEMENT

Between the Community College of Rhode Island and Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts

- 1. Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts guarantees admission of transfer students completing an Associates of Arts degree (transfer program) who have earned a grade point average of 2.5 or higher (on a 4.0 scale). MCLA will also admit students from CCRI in other Associates programs however the privileges of this agreement may not be extended to programs that are not transfer oriented.
- 2. Transfer students will receive academic credit for all college-level courses applied toward the requirements of the bachelor's degree at MCLA, excluding D grades. Students who are accepted with 60 transfer credits or more will be classified as juniors.
- 3. MCLA will not accept non-credit or remedial courses that are adjudged to be below college level.
- 4. Courses left to complete at MCLA towards the bachelor's degree will vary based on program. Major courses will be evaluated based on course equivalency to MCLA courses. Upper level courses required may require necessary prerequisites(s), and if not taken at CCRI, the student would complete at MCLA prior to enrolling in the upper level course. Based on academic program and courses completed, Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts cannot guarantee every student the completion of requirements for the baccalaureate degree in four semesters, however in many cases four semesters may be sufficient for completion of the bachelor's degree.
- 5. MCLA's catalog contains all information about degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate degree program are encouraged to communicate early with the transfer counselor at Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts to secure specific information about transfer credits.
- 6. CCRI students will be considered on a first come, first serve basis for housing on campus. Residence hall living is limited to traditional age students. Financial aid will also be available to CCRI students with the priority packaging of aid occurring in early March. The deadline for applying for financial aid is March 1st.

7. This agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised by mutual agreement. The agreement is expected to continue in force indefinitely but may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.
